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Bridge Reconstruction Bill Approved by House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee

The National Highway Bridge Reconstruction and Inspection Act of 2007 (H.R. 3999) was approved by the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee at a hearing on Wednesday. Sponsored by Committee Chair Jim Oberstar (D-MN), the legislation would require immediate updates of bridge inspection standards; strengthen training, certification, and qualifications standards for bridge inspectors; require immediate inspection of all structurally deficient bridges; and require states to calculate the load rating for structurally deficient bridges to ensure that maximum weight limits are properly posted.

Additionally, the legislation implements a risk-based prioritization for reconstruction of structurally deficient bridges and asks the National Academy of Sciences to conduct an independent review of the Department of Transportation's method of assigning risk-based priorities. Finally, the bill requires that states implement Bridge Management Systems to improve inspection processes and data collection.

The bill reported from the committee is funded through an increased authorization under SAFETEA-LU of \$2 billion over two years. The legislation also prohibits congressional or administration earmarks under the program.

ASCE has been a supporter of the Bridge Reconstruction Program concept since its inception. ASCE members have testified four times before Congress on bridge safety and inspection since the collapse of the I 35 W Bridge in Minneapolis. "It's a natural fit for our two organizations to work together to further each other's vision and activities to enhance the welfare of humanity," said ASCE president David G. Mongan, P.E., F.ASCE. With the administrative and financial support provided by ASCE in the new agreement—up to \$500,000—EWB-USA will be able to expand their role in educating engineering students and professionals while empowering developing communities through the creation of locally sustainable solutions, and ASCE members will gain a greater opportunity to contribute to and participate in EWB-USA projects and programs.


Region 3 Update

Region 3 Governor for Ohio Dave Pritchard attended the Region 3 governor's meeting and the National ASCE Convention in Orlando at the end of October. The program included information on ASCE's recent endorsement of green design principles, and the Body-of-Knowledge program for increasing the standard for licensure to a Bachelor's degree plus 30 hours of advanced study. The National Council of Engineering Examiners, representing the engineering licensing boards of the States reaffirmed its support for this longrange goal for a higher standard for licensing engineers in the US.

The Society also announced that it was running a substantial financial surplus this year, and would devote a portion of those funds to development of an improved website to meet ASCE Member needs. Also, ASCE has entered into an agreement with the independent group Engineers Without Borders to provide administrative services to the volunteer assistance programs of that organization. EWB has experienced phenomenal interest and growth over the past several years especially among engineering students and young engineers in pursuing its goal of effective and sustainable development for poor countries; ASCE is also including optional membership in EWB on your ASCE dues statement this year, with membership via ASCE costing \$60, a substantial discount from the standard \$100 cost for direct EWB membership.

The Green / sustainability direction of ASCE was also emphasized through reports on residential and commercial property developments in the Orlando area that used urban design features to minimize sprawl and increase the efficiency of energy use in transportation. The program also included inauguration of the 2008 ASCE President, David Mongan, and President -Elect Wayne Klotz. We hope to have Mr. Klotz as speaker at our annual installation of officers for the Central Ohio Section next May.

The program also included Committee meetings and programs on Communications, Sustainability and International Engineering.
