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### **Leonard Elected 2009 President-Elect**

Blaine Leonard, P.E., F.ASCE, research program manager for the Utah Department of Transportation in Salt Lake City, was recently named president-elect of the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE). Leonard will be installed as president-elect Nov. 8, 2008 during the business meeting at ASCE's Annual Civil Engineering Conference in Pittsburgh, Pa., and will be installed as president in the fall of 2009.

Leonard has been with the Utah DOT since 2001. In that position, he is responsible for balancing needs, priorities and resources in the Research Division, as well as managing a wide variety of geotechnical, structural, seismic, environmental, and traffic safety research efforts. He manages the applied research program – including the project selection process and budgets.
