LEED Practices on Ohio School Facilities Commission (OSFC) Projects

The Ohio State School for the Blind (OSSB) and Ohio School for the Deaf (OSD) are preparing or a \$43 million dollar facelift. Built in the 1950's on a former golf course, the two schools are separated by a conservation district that surrounds the stretch of Bill Moose Run from Indianola to High Street. The proposed new work for the campus includes 127,000 square feet of new academic buildings, 44,000 square feet of new student housing, a proposed bridge connecting the campuses, bioswales and native plantings at each site, sensory garden at OSSB and dedicated alumni garden at OSD, all while attempting to maintaining as much of the existing mature landscape as possible.

Come listen to the design team discuss the challenges of this unique site as we strive to design a LEED Gold project. Special focus of the presentation will be LEED and Site Sustainable Practices, working with the Franklin Soil and Water Conservation District and goals of good water quality design, as well as changes to the LEED program (AP+ program, new LEED programs, highlighting changes to site sustainability credits).








2010 Robert O'Shea Engineering Ethics Award

The Robert O'Shea Engineering Ethics Award for Ohio ASCE Student Chapter and Younger Members is awarded annually by the Ohio Council of ASCE on the basis of papers on professional ethics. One winner will be selected and awarded a cash award in the amount of \$250, with a matching \$250 awarded to the chapter with which the winner is affiliated.

Younger members of any of the Ohio Sections of ASCE and undergraduate members of the ASCE Student Chapters/Clubs from any college or university located in Ohio who are in good standing at the time their papers are submitted are eligible for the award. For the purpose of this award, younger members are defined as associate members or members 35 years of age or less on February 1 in the year of the award.

Papers on any topic related to professional ethics for the practice of civil engineering will be considered for the award. Authors may select a topic of personal interest, or may wish to consider the following information when selecting a topic: Students or younger members submitting a paper for the Robert O'Shea Engineering Ethics Award may also want their paper to be considered for the applicable Daniel W. Mead Prize. Authors who plan to submit their paper for consideration for either of the Mead Prizes must write their paper using the topic selected for the applicable 2010 Mead Prize. The 2010 Mead Prize topic for students is "Ethics and the Civil Engineer of 2025". The 2010 Mead Prize topic for younger members is "What ethical problems might the engineer of 2025 encounter with advancements in technology and communication". Authors should consult the ASCE website www.asce.org for specific information and requirements regarding these submittals.

Papers for the Robert O'Shea Engineering Ethics Award are (a) to be submitted to the Chair of the Robert O'Shea Engineering Ethics Award Committee by January 15, 2010. Please visit http://www.ohioasce.org/ for additional submittal requirements. Papers are judged by a panel consisting of a member

from each of the six Ohio Sections of ASCE, and the winner will be invited to present the paper at the spring Ohio Council Meeting and receive the award.
