# OFFSHORE PRODUCTION - LESSONS LEARNED

### When: Friday May 27, 2011 - 10:30am

Location: 410 Hitchcock Hall, 2070 Neil Avenue, The Ohio State University, Columbus, OH 43210 **Topic: Lessons Learned about Offshore Production Facilities in Recent Hurricanes** 

Four of the strongest hurricanes on record recently passed through the offshore oil and gas facilities in the Gulf of Mexico: Hurricane Ivan in August, 2004, Hurricane Katrina in August 2005, Hurricane Rita in September 2005 and Hurricane Ike in 2008. The cumulative impact of these storms was significant, with hundreds of platforms destroyed, tens of billions of dollars in property loss, and several hundred million barrels of oil production removed from the U.S. oil supply. Remarkably, however, there were no fatalities or injuries to offshore workers because they were successfully evacuated in advance of each storm. This talk will address what happened and what we have learned from these intense hurricanes. Topics will include hurricane forces. the response of structures and foundations, wave-induced mudslides, and the overall performance of facilities such as temporary drill rigs, permanent production facilities and pipelines.

The speaker, Dr. Robert B. Gilbert, PhD, PE, is the Brunswick-Abernathy Professor in Civil,

Architectural and Environmental Engineering at The University of Texas at Austin. He joined the faculty in 1993. Prior to that, he earned B.S. (1987), M.S. (1988) and Ph.D. (1993) degrees in civil engineering from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. He also practiced with Golder Associates Inc. as a geotechnical engineer from 1988 to 1993. His expertise is the assessment, evaluation and management of risk in civil engineering. Applications include building foundations, slopes, pipelines, dams and levees, landfills, and groundwater and soil remediation systems. He teaches undergraduate, graduate and professional level courses. He conducts research supported by federal and state agencies and private industry. Recent activities include analyzing the performance of offshore platforms and pipelines in hurricanes; managing for earthquake and flooding risks the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta in California; and performing a forensic analysis of the New Orleans levee failures.

bon fiber reinforced polymer (FRP) composite arch tubes, which are lightweight and can be fabricated in the field. The tubes are filled with concrete, and eliminate the need for reinforcing steel. # US-33 NELSONVILLE BY-PASS SITE VISIT

On April 21, 2011 a group of 15 Ohio University Civil Engineering Students, ASCE Central Section members, ODOT staff, and representatives from Kokosing Construction toured Phase 2 of the three Phase US-33 Nelsonville By-Pass Project. The group was led by ODOT District 10 Deputy Director, Steve Williams, P.E. Mr. Williams showed the group several unique features of the project, such as one of the two massive Komatsu PC2000 excavators which have an 18 cubic yard, 25 ton bucket and burn 1,500 gallons of fuel per shift; the 8-foot tall right-of-way fence with "jump-outs" installed to prevent deer from entering the right-of-way; a snake crossing

tunnel equipp ed with a sky light and snake fence to funnel the local



timber rattlesnakes under the roadway; a one million plus cubic yard fill area, and the location of several reclaimed clay mines.

After the tour the Annual ASCE Central Ohio Section Dinner meeting was attended by 35 ASCE Members and Guest at the new \$35 million, 100,000 square-foot Academic & Research Center located on the Ohio University Campus. Following dinner the Ohio University and Ohio State Student Chapters of ASCE gave reports of their activities over the past year and were presented with their annual contribution from the Central Ohio Section.

Prior to the student chapter reports ODOT District 10 Deputy Director, Steve Williams, P.E. gave an in-depth presentation of the US-33 Nelsonville By-Pass to the group, explaining the project from conception in the 1950s through current construction activities. The finished by-pass will be roughly 8.5 miles in length, have moved several million cubic yards of dirt, reclaimed existing coal mines with more than 500,000 cubic yards of grout, built: deer, snake, amphibian, and butterfly crossing through an existing national forest, and cost approximately \$173 million, which includes \$23 million for Phase1 and \$150 million from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funds for Phase 2 and 3. The scheduled opening date for the project is July 31, 2013.

# CALL FOR GEOTECHNICAL ABSTRACTS

Sponsored by the Geo-Institute, ASCE will be publishing a Geotechnical Special Publication (GSP) volume titled "Foundation Engineering in the Face of Uncertainty" (subtitled "Site Heterogeneity, Property Variability, Risk, and Reliability-Based Design"), Honoring Professor Fred H. Kulhawy, Ph.D., P.E., G.E., D.GE, Dist.M.ASCE. Mohamad Hussein, Kok-Kwang Phoon, and James Withiam will serve as editors. Abstracts for proposed papers dealing with topics related to the main theme are being sought for consideration. Possible topics are:

- Geologic modeling for ground characterization
- Spatial variability (natural ground, modified ground)
- Test measurement errors (laboratory/field)
- Transformation uncertainties pertaining to design properties
- Soil/rock property statistics (distributions, correlations)
- Model/bias factors in design equations
- Probabilistic/reliability methods

- Random finite element methods
- Limit state design (ultimate, serviceability, economic, etc.)
- Reliability-based design (RBD)
- Simplified RBD (partial factor design, LRFD, MRFD, etc.)
- Bayesian updating (from quality control, load tests, monitoring, etc.)
- Risk assessment and management
- User-friendly design/analysis tools
- Role of field measurements and testing in improving reliability
- Case histories

Deadline for a maximum 300-word abstract is July 31, 2011. Finished manuscripts are expected in July 2012. The GSP will be released at a specialty symposium during the G-I's 2013 annual meeting.
