2013 ASCE NATIONAL INFRASTRUCTURE REPORT CARD

STREPORT AMERICA'S NERASTRUCTURE

In a much anticipated release, ASCE's 2013 Report Card for America's Infrastructure gave the nation's infrastructure an overall grade of D+, showing slight progress from the D in the last Report Card issued in 2009. It's the first time since ASCE started producing Report Cards in 1998 that the grades rose overall and in several sectors.

Released Tuesday, March 19, in Washington, D.C., the report provides our nation's political leaders, policymakers, business leaders, infrastructure stakeholders, the media, and the general public with expert advice from the civil engineering community about the condition of infrastructure across the nation.

"As civil engineers, ASCE believes that we are the stewards of infrastructure—we designed it, we built it, and we actually oversee the operations and maintenance of it in many cases," notes ASCE President Gregory E. DiLoreto, P.E., F.ASCE. "So as stewards, we have a responsibility with the Report Card to call attention to the state of the nation's infrastructure. We as Americans need to be proactive in monitoring and taking care of our infrastructure so that it will be here not only for us, but for our children and our grandchildren."

Individual grades were given in the categories of aviation, bridges, dams, drinking water, energy, hazardous waste, inland waterways, levees, ports, public parks and recreation, rail, roads, schools, solid waste, transit, and wastewater. Final grades were assigned based on capacity to meet future demand, condition, funding, future needs, operation and maintenance, public safety, resilience, and innovation.

The Report Card concludes that to raise the grades and get our infrastructure at an acceptable level, a total investment of \$3.6 trillion is needed by 2020 across the entire 16 sectors. Currently, only about \$2 trillion in infrastructure spending is projected, leaving an estimated shortfall of approximately \$1.6 trillion.

2013 OHIO OUTSTANDING CIVIL ENGINEERING ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

Presented by the Ohio Council of ASCE Sections, this award is given annually to a Civil Engineering project, not an individual or firm, to recognize the contribution of the many engineers who have worked on the project. The award is part of the <u>ASCE National OCEA Program</u>.

Selection is based on how the project demonstrates the application of civil engineering skills and its contribution to civil engineering progress and mankind. The project's potential adverse effects will be considered. Entries should look frankly at the project's problems, technical and otherwise. Judges will consider the following criteria:

- 1. Contribution to the well-being of people and communities,
- 2. Resourcefulness in planning and in the solution of design problems,
- 3. Pioneering use of materials and methods,
- 4. Innovations in construction, and
- 5. Impact on the physical environment, unusual aspects, and aesthetic values.

ASCE LEGISLATIVE FLY-IN

From March 19-20, 2013, ASCE National hosted the 13th Annual Legislative Fly-In in Washington, D.C. It marked the first time in the history of the event that representatives from all 50 states were present. Attendees were briefed on upcoming legislation in the House and Senate that are important to improving infrastructure, as shown in the Report Card.



Members of Congress were asked to support passage of the Water Resources Development Act (WRDA), making it's way through the Senate, which includes creating a National Levee Safety Program, re-authorizing the National Dam Safety

Program, increasing revenues for the Inland Waterways Trust Fund, and restoring trust in the Harbor Maintenance Trust Fund.

ASCE representatives also urged Congress to identify a long term solution for funding the Highway Trust Fund, and work on a long-term re-authorization of the Surface Transportation Bill when the current MAP-21 bill expires in September, 2014.

A contingent of Ohio representatives, including Central Ohio Section Members David Pritchard, Jim Pajk, and Brooks Vogel, met with the offices of Senators Brown and Portman and Central Ohio Representatives Tiberi, Beatty, and Stivers to urge their support of these critical issues.
