

Presenters comprised of public agencies, consultants, and contractors to gain a broad understanding of the development, design, construction, and operations of roundabouts. Seminar sessions included:

 Multiple public agencies reviewed their experiences in planning and public support for roundabout projects.



- Consultant review of the planning side of roundabouts, including the traffic and safety benefits and when roundabouts are (and aren't) appropriate.
- Consultant review of design considerations for single and multi-lane roundabouts.
- Hands-on activity allowing attendees to design and draw their own roundabouts.
- Contractor's review of construction related considerations when building a roundabout.
- Case studies from public agencies and consultants examining the good, bad, and ugly from roundabouts that have been in operation, and measures that were taken to improve them after construction.

- Pile Dynamics Inc.'s Thermal Integrity Profiler is the winner of the Charles Pankow Award for Innovation.


 Anil K. Kar, Ph.D., P.E., F.ASCE, was the recipient of the Michel Award for Industry Advancement of Research.
