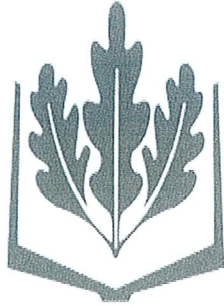

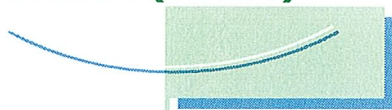

Presentation Abstracts:

Introduction to the LEED Process: This presentation will identify the purpose, history and requirements of the LEED process. Throughout the presentation information will be provided to explain the US Green Building Council and the rating systems and levels of certifications that can be achieved during the LEED process. Also, the key factors that go into the LEED certification, such as design, types of materials used, cost of construction, affects on the environment and alternative uses of energy will be discussed. *Presented by Mr. Stephen Zilles, AIA, LEED AP from Karlsberger.*

Case Study of the LEED Process: This presentation will identify the step-by-step account of the LEED process for the Dell Children's Medical Center in Austin, Texas. The Dell Children's Medical Center in Austin was the world's first LEED Platinum certified hospital and has been used as the benchmark for LEED design in medical facilities. The presentation will identify the owner and design teams goals that were set from the start of the project, what pitfalls were

encountered during the process and what hurdles had to be overcome to meet all of the identified levels of certification throughout the design and construction phase of the project. *Presented by Mr. Joseph Kuspan, AIA from Karlsberger.*

Legal Implications to LEED Construction and Regulatory Update: This presentation will discuss the legal implications of the LEED process and identify the regulatory changes that will be occurring. The legal aspect will cover the implied warranties in LEED construction, the liabilities for not achieving the desired certifications and other legal pitfalls and considerations of the LEED process. There will also be information provided on the regulatory update and changes in the LEED process on a federal, state and local basis along with the Ohio School Facilities Commission (OSFC). *Presented by Mr. Greg Lestini and Mr. Scott Davis from Bricker & Eckler LLP.*

Learning and Study Session of the LEED Exam: This presentation will discuss the new multi level tier system that will go into effect in 2009 for LEED AP individuals, including identification of Tier I, II and III of the classification process. Also, a team of professionals will provide an overview of the type of topics, questions and formatting that will appear on the exam. *Presented by Ms. Karen Craddock AIA, LEED AP, Mr. Brent King ASLA, LEED AP, and Mr. Carl Lucius, AIA, LEED AP of Karlsberger.*

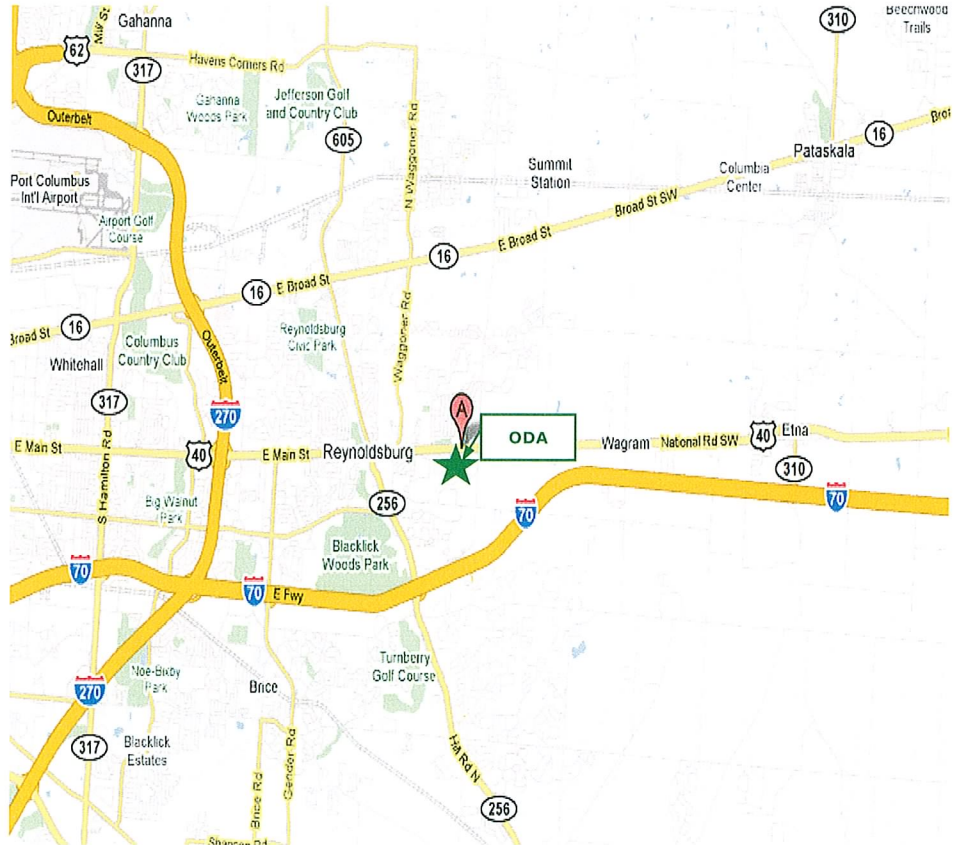
